





ANNUAL REPORT FOR YEAR ENDING 31 DECEMBER 2022

STATEMENT OF GOALS AND PURPOSE

The purpose of FreeSchools World Literacy is to provide free education in order to break the cycle of ignorance and poverty that leaves millions in hopeless despair. The organization provides free literacy programs; teacher employment and training; income-producing skills, health education; food and clothing; and is documenting changes in the wellbeing of the community as a result of its programs. By providing ongoing funds and scholarships for the existing and planned new schools, FreeSchools World Literacy hopes to replicate its model throughout India and other developing countries of the world.

FreeSchools World Literacy Objectives are as follows:

- 1. To provide literacy programs and classes to members of the public.
- 2. To develop and provide education and training programs to persons who will conduct literacy training.
- 3. To develop employment training and education programs for needy persons.
- 4. To relieve poverty in developing nations by providing food and other basic supplies to persons in need.
- 5. To develop or promote public health in developing nations by educating and instructing the public on prevention of and curative measures for, health problems and by researching and documenting changes in the health of the community

PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

President's Report

I am proud to announce that Australian donors have raised a total of \$111,902 towards our educational efforts since FreeSchools World Literacy's humble beginnings in the year 2000 as a single-classroom evening school for the poor children of Motihari village—a concept developed by our in-country partner, Sister Crescence, with help from founding supporter Mark Bloomfield.

Over the past two decades the outcomes have been life-changing for thousands of children otherwise unable to attain an education, with the benefit of that knowledge flowing from the students to their families and to the local community.

The Passing of Ian Esmore—FreeSchools World Literacy Public Officer and Secretary

It is with great sadness that I report the passing of Ian Esmore, our Committee of Management's Public Officer and Secretary.

Ian was involved with FreeSchools World Literacy since its inception in 2000. He loved the concept of FreeSchools and what the charity was able to achieve in the bettering of the lives, via education, of some of India's and Thailand's most underprivileged children.

Ian was responsible for development of our 'Modal Laws of the Organisation' and the formation and structure of our Committee of Management. He was involved with the formal incorporation of the Australian branch of FreeSchools World Literacy on the 16th July 2007 (number A0050403N) with Consumer Affairs Victoria. As a member of Rotary in Victoria, Ian was also responsible for our close association with that organization over the years.

Ian was elected foundational Secretary/Public Officer at our first Annual General Meeting in 2007 and has been re-elected onto the Committee every year since that time.

Ian's drive and desire has formed the cornerstone of our Committee over the years and his infectious enthusiasm will be sorely missed from our ranks.

Our Schools

In Bihar State, we have 1148 students being taught by 27 teachers at 23 FreeSchools World Literacy funded centres.

A total of \$4,116 was raised during the 2022 reporting period for the FreeSchools centres in Bihar, India, thanks to our dedicated group of regular donors¹ including Phil and Pam Allen, Melissa Alldis, Bernie & Merindi Belarski, Ian & Isobel Esmore, Marion Lesaffre, Julian Martin, Julian McGarry, Chelsea McLean, Bob Mills, Ken Morley, Che Stapleton, Kathleen & Trevor Swadling, Andrew & Delphine Swadling, Warrick & Lorna Brady, the Coenraads Family's Francis C. Nieves Memorial Fund, the Forest Kirk Men's Fellowship and the Forest Kirk Women's Fellowship. This also includes payment of \$700 for scholarships for five girls. FreeSchools World Literacy annual registration fees of \$59.20 were donated and paid directly by Secretary Ian Esmore.

FreeSchools World Literacy maintains high-quality audited annual accounts and reportage presented to Australian Council for International Development (ACFID) standard and which have been audited by accountant Bob Mills.

Finally, I would especially like to thank the FreeSchools World Literacy Committee of Management, many of whom have been members and donors since the Committee's inception.



Statement:

- 1. FreeSchools World Literacy is reliant on donations for its overseas projects and is financially healthy. During 2022 FreeSchools raised \$4,096, and dispersed \$4,116 bringing its available cash balance to \$30 on December 31, 2022.
- 2. These donated funds were disbursed in their entirety to FreeSchools project in Bihar, India where they were used to pay, as follows: \$3,376 for 2022 salaries of teachers working at FreeSchools centres, \$700 for 2022 scholarships for five girls, and \$40 bank international transfer charges. This works out to be an average cost of about \$15 to \$20 per year per child being educated and we consider this application of donor funds to be highly effective in providing an education to disadvantaged children.
- 3. Although currently not a financial member of the Australian Council for International Development (ACFID), FreeSchools World Literacy remains fully committed to full adherence to the ACFID Code of Conduct.
- 4. Complaints can be lodged against FreeSchools World Literacy with the President of the Organization, Dr Robert Coenraads, or any of the other members of the FreeSchools World Literacy Committee of Management, whose full contact details are provided in this report.
