2. Welcome and background briefing by the Chairperson/President.

Dear Committee and Friends,

Welcome to our 2022 AGM this Saturday morning 19th of March. Our meeting will run for a few weeks, thereby allowing all of the Committee Members ample time to participate. This year we will try to be a little quicker to enable Ian Esmore to submit our meeting minutes and reports on time.

The main purpose of this meeting is to present the 2021 Annual Report containing the audited accounts of FreeSchools World Literacy for 2021, and to elect our new Committee of Management for 2022 according to the standard Agenda for the 2022 AGM.

3. Minutes of previous year's Annual General Meeting (AGM) 2021

4. President's Report. As circulated to membership

It has been over two decades now since Mark Bloomfield and I travelled to Motihari Evening School in Bihar State, India in 2000 – a single schoolhouse for the poor children of the village being run by Sister Crescence. There, I realised for the first time in my life, the real need for free education for the poor, and the ability of education to drastically change the lives of those lucky enough to receive it. I also saw the benefits of that knowledge flow from the student to their families and into the local community. Since that time, Australian donors have raised a total of \$107,806 towards our educational efforts.

2021 has been another difficult year for the world as a whole, and particularly for our Indian FreeSchools. Our in-country co-ordinator, Sister Mary Crescence reports that the Bihar region continued to be plagued by job losses due to the Covid pandemic and damage to infrastructure, homes and crops due to flooding of the Ganges River and its tributaries, combined with an unusually severe winter.

As a result Australia participated in the funding of two emergency programs during 2021; the food relief program and the winter clothing appeal. In spite of these setbacks, Bihar's Free Schools and the Bridge Course have continued to operate successfully.

In Bihar State, we have 1148 students being taught by 27 teachers at 23 FreeSchools World Literacy funded centres.

With respect to our current scholarship students, Sister Crescence advises that Shilpi (funded by the Forest Kirk Kidz Church) finished Class 10th grade this year, and that five promising new students have been selected as prospective candidates for our scholarship program.

A total of \$5,815 was raised during the 2021 reporting period for the Free Schools in Bihar, India, thanks to our dedicated group of regular donors including Melissa Alldis, Bernie & Merindi Belarski, Janine Campbell, Ian & Isobel Esmore, Marion Lesaffre, Julian Martin, Chelsea McLean, Bob Mills, Ken Morley, Saskia Raevouri, Che Stapleton, Kathleen & Trevor Swadling, Andrew & Delphine Swadling, Warrick & Lorna Brady, the Coenraads Family's Francis C. Nieves Memorial Fund, Margaret Walls, and the Forest Kirk Women's Fellowship. This also includes a scholarship raised by the Forest Kirk KidzChurch for Shilpi). FreeSchools World Literacy annual registration fees of \$59.20 were donated and paid directly by Secretary Ian Esmore.

FreeSchools World Literacy maintains high-quality audited annual accounts and reportage presented to Australian Council for International Development (ACFID) standard.

Finally, I would especially like to thank the FreeSchools World Literacy Committee of Management, many of whom have been members and donors since the Committee's inception.

### 5. Treasurer's Report.

I have the pleasure of submitting the FreeSchools World Literacy Financial Report and Audited Accounts for the year ended 31st December 2021 as part of full FreeSchools World Literacy Annual Report for 2021. The accounts are an unbroken record dating back to the beginnings of FSWL in 2001 and are presented in ACFID standard format.

#### Statement:

- 1. FreeSchools World Literacy is reliant on donations for its overseas projects and is financially healthy. During 2021 FreeSchools raised \$5,815 and disbursed \$9,780 (which includes international transfer of funds to India \$4.015.56 on 8/1/2021 for 2020 donations, \$1,500 on 30/8/2021 for pandemic and flood relief, and \$4,225 on 29/12/2021 for 2021 donations, and \$40 transfer fees). On December 31, 2021 the available cash balance was \$50.
- 2. These funds were disbursed in their entirety to FreeSchools project in Bihar, India where they were used to pay salaries of teachers working at the FreeSchools according to the disbursement letter. This works out to be an average cost of about \$15 to \$20 per year per child being educated and we consider this application of donor funds to be highly effective in providing an education to disadvantaged children.
- 3. Although currently not a financial member of ACFID, FreeSchools World Literacy remains fully committed to full adherence to the ACFID Code of Conduct.
- 4. Complaints can be lodged against FreeSchools World Literacy with the President of the Organization, Dr Robert Coenraads, or any of the other members of the FreeSchools World Literacy Committee of Management, whose full contact details are provided in this report.
